

Antique quilts are among the most well-loved quilts. Included in this ebook are three wonderfully homey quilts. Honeycomb is a true antique from the 1880s while Scrap Sensation and Buds 'n Bow Ties are made using reproduction fabrics for that same antique appearance. All three quilts invite you to dig into your fabric stash for a wide variety of prints and colors. Whether it's hand piecing, appliqué or piecing by machine, you'll find it all among these three delightful patterns.

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Scrap Sensation Honeycomb Buds 'n Bow Ties

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All fabric requirements are based on 40"/42"-wide fabric. The yardage given includes an additional amount to account for fabric shrinkage and individual differences in cutting. A 1/4" seam allowance is included on pattern pieces when required. All measurements for pieces, sashing, and borders include $^{1/4}$ seam allowances. The finished quilt size is the size of the quilt before quilting. Because each quiltmaker usually has a personal preference for a particular type of batting, the type of batting to be used for each quilt will not be listed, unless it is necessary to obtain a specific look. Fabric listed for binding includes yardage for straight-grain binding. Due to variations in materials and equipment, McCall's Quilting disclaims any

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

Planning

Sarah and Dolores used a wide variety of traditional prints, including 1800s repro fabrics, in this sparkling one-block quilt. Use an accurate 1/4" seam allowance throughout construction.



Fabric Requirements

Assorted light prints

(blocks) $4\frac{1}{4}-4\frac{1}{2}$ yds. **total**

Assorted dark prints

(blocks) 41/4-41/2 yds. **total**

Tan print

(sashing posts) 3/8 yd. Black print (sashing) 21/8 yds.

Rust print (inner

border, binding) 15/8 yds.

Green print

(outer border) 13/8 yds.

Backing

(piece widthwise) 77/8 yds. Batting size 92" x 110"

Cutting Instructions

(cut in order listed)

Assorted light prints—cut a total of: 640 squares 27/8" x 27/8"

Assorted dark prints—cut a total of: 640 squares 27/8" x 27/8"

Tan print

99 squares 11/2" x 11/2"

Black print

178 strips 11/2" x 81/2"

Rust print

11 strips 21/2" x width of fabric (WOF) for binding

*2 strips 2" x 96", pieced from 5 WOF strips

*2 strips 2" x 80", pieced from 4 WOF strips

Green print

*2 strips 41/4" x 100", pieced from 5 WOF strips

*2 strips 41/4" x 88", pieced from 5 WOF strips

*Border strips include extra length for trimming.

Piecing the Blocks

① Draw diagonal line on wrong side of assorted light 27/8" square. Referring to Diagram I, place marked square on assorted dark 27/8" square, right sides together. Sew 1/4" seam on each side of marked line; cut apart on marked line. Open and press to make 2 pieced squares. Make 1280 total.



2 Referring to Diagram II, sew 4 rows of 4 pieced squares each. Sew rows together to make Mosaic Block. Make 80 total.

Assembling the Quilt Top

Note: Refer to Assembly Diagram for following steps. Watch orientation of blocks during assembly.

3 Stitch 11 sashing rows using 9 tan print squares and 8 black print strips each. Stitch 10 block rows using 9 black print strips and 8 blocks each. Sew rows together, alternating.

4 Sew rust 96" strips to sides; trim even with top and bottom. Sew rust 80" strips to top/bottom; trim even with sides. Stitch green 100" strips to sides; trim even. Stitch green 88" strips to top/bottom; trim even.


Quilting and Finishing

5 Layer, baste, and quilt. Connie machine quilted 2 different motifs in blocks, alternating placement. Sashing rows feature wavy lines. The inner border is filled with a single cable, and the outer border is quilted with a repeating motif. Bind with rust print.

Honeycomb

Made in Cumberland County, Pennsylvania around 1880, this interesting quilt features many unusual prints of the period.

Finished Quilt Size

67" x 78"

Note: Template is printed at end of pattern without seam allowance for use with English paperpiecing method.







Planning a reproduction

We recommend using the English paperpiecing method for this quilt. Freezer paper templates are cut to the exact size needed and ironed to precut fabric rectangles. Since the freezer paper edges mark the exact seam line, pieces fit together perfectly, eliminating the need for consistent seam allowances to achieve accuracy. After hexagons are stitched together, freezer paper templates can be removed and reused. This construction method makes for a very portable project. Just pack prepared fabric rectangles, needles, scissors, and thread and you're all set!

You will need:

Assorted dark prints 33/4-41/4 yds. total
Assorted light prints 31/2-4 yds. total

21/8 yds.

Cheddar solid (border, binding)

Backing (piece lengthwise) 5 yds. Batting 76" x 86"

Freezer paper

Cutting Instructions

Assorted dark prints—cut a total of: 644 rectangles 2" x 3³/4"
Assorted light prints—cut a total of: 585 rectangles 2" x 3³/4"
Cheddar solid
4 strips 5¹/2" x 72", cut on lengthwise

English Paper-Piecing

1 Trace Template A onto dull side of freezer paper and cut out. Hint: Trace shapes along one end of freezer paper and fold accordion style. Staple centers of folded templates to stabilize. Use drawn lines to accurately cut multiple layers at one time. Remove staples.

2 Referring to **Diagram I**, center and carefully press shiny side of paper template onto wrong side of 2" x 33/4" rectangle. Allowing approximately 1/4" seam allowance, trim fabric corners.




3 Fold seam allowances over template paper edges (Diagram II); finger-press. Without piercing template paper, baste by backstitching at each corner. Make 644 assorted dark and 585 assorted light total.



4 With right sides together, whipstitch 2 assorted dark hexagons together along long side (Diagram III). Catch only a few threads of each fabric to avoid stitches showing on right side. Double stitch seam ends to secure. Repeat process to make strip of 46 assorted dark hexagons (Diagram IV). Make 14 total. Repeat process to make strip of 45 assorted light hexagons. Make 13 total.

Quilt Top Assembly, Quilting, and Finishing

5 Using whipstitch, join rows, alternating dark and light rows (**Diagram V**). After hexagon has been stitched on all sides, remove freezer paper. Freezer paper templates can be reused.



6 Referring to **Diagram VI**, trim edges even.







Referring to Assembly Diagram, stitch cheddar 5½" x 72" strips to sides; trim even with top and bottom. Stitch remaining 5½" x 72" strips to top/bottom; trim even with sides.

3 Layer, baste, and quilt. Vertical rows of hexagons were hand outline quilted. The border is filled with a chevron pattern, with lines of stitching 1" apart. Bind with cheddar solid.

Print at 100% (no scaling). This box measures 2 inches wide by 1 inch high. Use this as an accuracy guide when printing the templates.

You Need:

Assorted prints 21/4-21/2 (blocks, buds, bow) yds. total Cream solid (blocks, outer border) 23/4 yds. Pink solid (inner border) 1/2 yd. Green solid (vines, leaves) 1/2 yd. Assorted green 1/4-3/8 yd. prints (leaves) total Pink print (binding) 3/4 yd. Backing (piece widthwise) 33/4 yds. 66" x 84" **Batting** Paper-backed fusible web 1 yd.

1/2" bias bar (optional)

Plan

Toby used a selection of reproduction prints for this cheerful charmer, but her pattern lends itself well to any scrappy collection. Dig into your stash; you may have everything you need for this quilt right at your fingertips!

Cut

(in order listed)

Assorted prints

cut 70 matching sets of:

2 squares 2" x 2"

2 squares 31/2" x 31/2"

cut a total of:

15 squares 3" x 3" 2 strips 2" x 36"

Cream solid

*4 strips 61/2" x 66", cut on lengthwise grain

140 squares 31/2" x 31/2"

Pink solid

*2 strips 11/2" x 64", pieced from 4 width of fabric (WOF) strips

*2 strips 11/2" x 48", pieced from 3 WOF strips

Green solid

**1 bias-cut strip 11/2" x 130", made from 16" square

12 Template A

Assorted green prints

cut 15 sets of:

2 matching Template A


*Border strips include extra length for trimming.

Sew

1 Draw diagonal line on wrong side of assorted print 2" square with marking tool of your choice. Referring to Diagram I, place assorted print square on cream 3½" square, right sides together, aligning raw edges. Stitch on drawn line; trim away and discard excess fabric. Press open to make pieced square. Make 70 sets of 2 matching.

2 Arrange and sew 2 rows using matching pieced squares and matching assorted print 3½" squares (Diagram II); sew rows together to make Bow Tie Block. Make 70 total.






3 Referring to Assembly Diagram, sew 10 rows of 7 blocks each; sew rows together. Stitch pink solid 1½" x 64" strips to sides; trim even with top and bottom. Stitch remaining pink strips to top/bottom; trim even with sides. Sew cream 6½" x 66" strips to sides; trim even. Sew remaining cream strips to top/bottom; trim even.




Assembly Diagram

4 Fold 1½" x 130" green solid bias-cut strip in half, wrong sides together (Diagram III). Stitch ¼" from raw edge. Trim seam allowance to ½". Press tube flat, centering seam allowance on back so raw edge isn't visible from front. Using ½" bias bar makes pressing faster and easier. Cut strip into 2 lengths of 16", 1 of 36", and 1 of 52".

5 Referring to photo, position 16" vines on top and left cream borders, 36" vine on bottom border, and 52" vine on right border. Machine or hand buttonhole stitch (Diagram IV) in place.



6 To make folded buds, fold assorted print 3" square on diagonal, wrong sides together (Diagram V). Fold points in to center; tack at raw edge point through all layers. Make 15 total. Position buds on cream border; tack in place.




7 Trace Template A on paper side of paper-backed fusible web. Cut apart, leaving small margin beyond drawn lines. Following manufacturer's instructions, fuse to wrong side of appropriate fabrics; cut apart on drawn lines. Position Template A leaves over bud raw edges and along vines. Following manufacturer's instructions, fuse in place. Machine or hand buttonhole stitch around leaves, securing bud raw edges, leaving folded edges free.



Print at 100% (no scaling). This box measures 2 inches wide by 1 inch high. Use this as an accuracy guide when printing the templates.

(3) Layer and baste quilt top for quilting method of your choice. Toby machine quilted horizontally and vertically in the ditch along every quarter-block seam line, and diagonally through the cream patches. The pink border was ditch quilted, and the appliqués were outline stitched. Additional vines, leaves, and blossoms were quilted in the open areas of the cream border. Bind quilt with pink print fabric (see Quiltmaking Fundamentals).

3 Referring to Diagram VI, mark diagonal lines on ends of 2 assorted print 2" x 36" strips. Place right sides together, aligning raw edges, and sew on marked lines and a ¼" seam along long sides, leaving 4" opening for turning. Trim diagonal seams and corners; turn and press. Hand stitch opening closed. Tie strip into bow; tack in place.


